The services provided from the existing Kincardine Health Centre are primarily provided in support of the population needs of the people of Kincardine and surrounding areas, with 98% of the resident population registered with the affected GP practice living in this area.

It is worth noting that the General Practice in Kincardine is contracted to NHS Forth Valley, though the premises and community services are provided by NHS Fife.

As part of the IAD, long-list and short-list options were considered. The preferred option – a new build in Kincardine – would contribute to meeting national outcomes for integration; in particular:

- Outcome 3: people who use health and social care services have positive experiences of those services, and have their dignity respected
- Outcome 5: health and social care services contribute to reducing health inequalities
- Outcome 9: resources are used effectively in the provision of health and care services.

### The preferred options would provide:

- > Integrated and coordinated care, i.e. potential to develop new models of care across health, social and other services; increased access to a range of services; significant improvement in the physical environment
- Quality / patient care, i.e. improved capacity to deliver an increased range of services in an integrated way; improved accessibility; ability to provide group work
- > Improving staff wellbeing, i.e. significant improvement in the physical environment including staff facilities; safer working; significant improvement in morale
- Reducing inequalities, i.e. potential to target health inequalities; accessibility will be greatly improved within the facility
- Risk and harm, i.e. reduce the potential for risk and harm to patients, carers, visitors and staff by the provision of safe, modern, and fit for purpose buildings
