Who Are the Pharmacy Team?

The team includes:

- Pharmacists
- Pharmacy Technicians

They are Registered Health Care Professionals who help patients to use their medicines safely and effectively.

Benefits of the Pharmacy Team in a GP Practice

- They can discuss your medicines with you.
- They are specialists in medicines.
- They can talk to your local pharmacy about medication queries.
- They can free up GP time.

A Pharmacist can:

- Review your medicines with you to check they are safe and effective, on the telephone or in person.
- Prescribe medicines (after appropriate training).
- See you in the GP practice, at home or in a care home.
- Request blood tests, if required.

A Pharmacy Technician can:

- Give you advice on how to manage your medicines.
- Assess if you need any additional help to take your medicines, e.g. provide a medication chart.
- See you in the GP practice, at home or in a care home.



What the Pharmacy Team do in your GP Practice:

- Help you to understand the medicines that you need to take and get the best from them.
- Deal with medicines and prescription queries that you may have.
- Review your medicines with you:
 - when you leave hospital, after an out-patient appointment or following a change to your medicines
 - to help with a long-term condition such as pain when you need to take many medicines
 - when you join the practice as a new patient
 - if you live in a care home
