## "Half day GCP update (Good Clinical Practice)"

Date: Tuesday 08<sup>th</sup> November Time: 9.30 – 12.30 Venue: R&D Meeting Room, QMH

This course is for anyone who has completed the full day GCP training course or equivalent and is due to update their training. It is essential that GCP training is updated every two years for those involved in CTIMPs. For those not involved in CTIMPs, it is still highly recommended.

The course will cover the Research Governance Framework and the principles of GCP using a combination of lecture and interactive workshops.

Topics covered include:

- Informed Consent
- Documentation and Data Management
- Safety Reporting

## "Full GCP Training (Good Clinical Practice)"

Date: Tuesday 15th November Time: 9.30 – 16.30 Venue: Common Room, QMH

This full day workshop is appropriate for staff who need to be familiar with Good Clinical Practice (for research) and may need to be fully trained in the more rigorous requirements of a clinical trial of an investigational medicinal product (CTIMP). The course is aimed at those staff undertaking both low risk projects (e.g. studies using questionnaires only) and high risk projects such as drug trials. At the end of the course those attending should be able to:

- Appreciate the need for regulation of clinical research
- Understand the UK legislative framework for CTIMPs
- Be familiar with the principles & conditions of Good Clinical Practice
- · Understand the practicalities of demonstrating GCP compliance.

Research Bulletin - September 2022 (Issue 79)

As part of aims to strengthen the research culture in the NHS and increase research capacity, the NHS Research Scotland (NRS) Career Researcher Fellowship scheme is now open. This award provides funding for protected time to contribute to, conduct and lead clinical research with applications to be submitted by 30 November 2022. Support is also being provided to increase the number of Scottish – led proposals for research funding. A virtual information event hosted by Chief Scientist Office on 24 October will explore the National Institute for Health and Care Research (NIHR) funding programmes and provide information on the opportunities available to Scottish-led researchers.

In other funding news, as part of the long-term goals set out in the Scottish Government's <u>Women's Health Plan</u>, a Women's Health Research Fund is to be established with the aim of closing gaps in scientific and medical knowledge in women's health for both sex specific and non sex-specific conditions, and to ensure the appropriate representation of women in clinical research. Those interested, and wishing to find out more about the Fund, can contact the team at <u>womenshealthplan@gov.scot</u>.

Wider participation in clinical research is critical across all areas of our work, and a new project is aiming to help those who work with people living with dementia, and their carers, to have better conversations about research. NHS Research Scotland's Neuroprogressive and Dementia Network (NRS NDN) is working closely with Alzheimer Scotland on the initiative that will help its 400 staff have 'Confident Conversations' about vital research with the people they support, aimed at engendering better two-way communication, building confidence, and ultimately broadening participation.

Also this month, the <u>National Contract Value Review process</u> for commercial research studies is being introduced across the UK on 1 October 2022; registration is now open for <u>NHS Highland's RD&I Conference</u>, the <u>NHS R&D Forum</u> and <u>DigiFest22</u>; and voting is now open for the Scottish Health Award's <u>People's Choice Award</u> and much more.

## <u>UK's first medical drone delivery project CAELUS enters next phase</u>

The Care & Equity – Healthcare Logistics UAS Scotland (CAELUS) project led by AGS Airports is working to deliver what will be the first national drone network that can transport laboratory samples, essential medicines and other medical supplies throughout Scotland including to remote communities. On 5<sup>th</sup> September, NHS stakeholders were invited to attend a workshop run by CAELUS project partners Connected Places Catapult and NHS Scotland, seeking a range of healthcare perspectives on the applications for drones developed so far in the CAELUS programme, additional NHS Scotland applications for drones that could be considered in this next phase and what the priorities should be for developing drone services with NHS Scotland. ## Landmark partnership aims to improve Scotland's health

A ground-breaking collaboration between NHS, university and industry partners has been launched to co-create NHS Scotland transformation through large scale programmes to improve the health of the population and expand clinical research.
